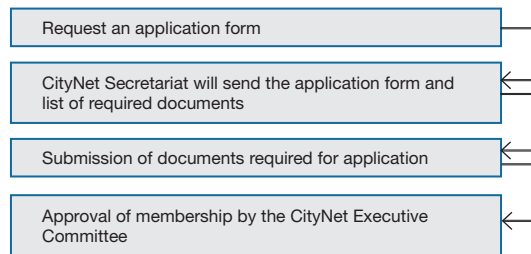

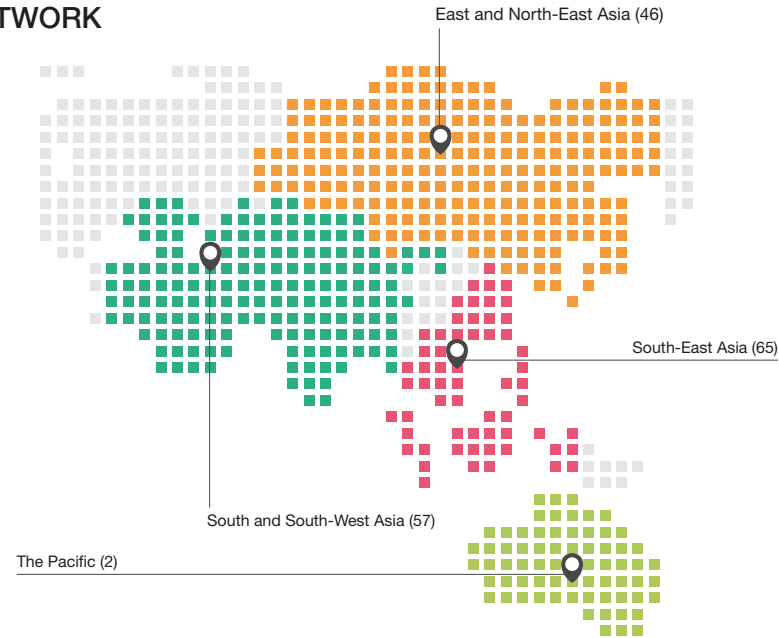
## MEMBERSHIP FEE
