Guidelines for Uploading and Writing Case Study & Columns

+ INTRODUCTION TO THE PLATFORM

The United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP), the Seoul Metropolitan Government and CityNet have established the Urban SDG Knowledge Platform to promote and support knowledge sharing and city-to-city cooperation for sustainable urban development.

The Urban SDG Knowledge Platform supports local action for the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, including up-take and replication of successful initiatives and good practices, by: Providing a repository of policies, initiatives and good practices at the city level by municipal governments and other stakeholders; Facilitating north-south, south-south, and triangular cooperation by linking cities that have developed specific policies, initiatives and good practices with other cities interested in learning from and replicating them; and, Facilitating regional follow-up and review of the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development by providing a platform for local governments to share progress and lessons learned.

+ Case Studies Guidelines

These guidelines are to assist cities or other partners writing new content for the Urban SDG Knowledge Platform. You can also have your existing content hosted on the Platform when it comes to uploading case study, but it must be adapted to fit the framework used by all case study on the platform.

Key tips to keep in mind.

For all original content types:

- The target audience is comprised of city practitioners, and the case studies and columns should be written by keeping this in mind through the language, information and framework of the content.
- Be as specific and action oriented and as directive as possible/ appropriate. Tell readers explicitly what you want them to take away, and aim for brevity.
- Focus on things that have happened policies brought in, programmes implemented, cost savings realised etc rather than things that are planned for the future.
- Use text boxes, graphics and quotes wherever useful. You can lift graphics from other resources, noting the source a high quality screen shot is usually fine.
- Columns could serve as part of the annual RECIPRO:CITY publication if the associated case study is selected for the publication. If so, the author of the column will be contacted ahead of time to seek his approval.



+ Case Studies

Case Study are the heart of the Urban SDG Knowledge Platform and are key for support and advancing Local SDG Implementation. Case Studies are the ways through which cities share their experiences to other cities. Therefore, case study should be written in such a way that they provide directions, instructions and orientations for other cities to be able to replicate and implement themselves similar practice.

The focus should **not be** mainly on what is the result, but **should be** on how was the result achieve, what was the process, the action and steps taken, the necessary policies and budget, the challenges faced and lessons learned, etc. You can imagine it as an "Everything you wish you someone told you if you were to do this project again."


Written in a concise and precise manner, easy to understand, to-the-point style and accompanied by project documents, photos, graphics, quotes, video clips, etc. The case will include:

- Title
- Short Summary
- Main thematic and identified related Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)
- Background, Challenges and Objectives
- Actions and Implementation process taken by the city
- Outcomes and Impacts
- Replicability and Scalability
- Budget

The United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP) is the regional development arm of the United Nations for the Asia-Pacific region. Made up of 53 Member States and 9 Associate Members, with a geographical scope that stretches from Turkey in the west to the Pacific island nation of Kiribati in the east, and from the Russian Federation in the north to New Zealand in the south, the region is home to 4.1 billion people, or two thirds of the world's population.
