2. Strengthen CityNet member cities' dialogue and multi-stakeholder cooperation in climate change and low carbon development fields;
3. Share best practices on low carbon action and climate change adaptation/mitigation;
4. Raise level of awareness among city officials on the complexity of climate change that requires a holistic approach;
5. Encourage peer learning, networking, multi-stakeholder collaboration between cities and development partners, and the formulation of possible partnerships among CityNet member cities.

The Program will provide a platform for sharing best practice approaches, learnings and insights among CityNet, non-CityNet members, and regional development experts.

Technical presentations, group discussions, interactive work sessions, networking and site visits will feature the three-day event.
