The evaluation for the 2020 Global Smart Solution Initiative submissions will be performed by a panel of judges, consisting of eight or more leading experts in Sustainable Development, Urban Planning and Smart City Programs.

The submitted cases will be evaluated through seven criteria:

- Compatibility/ Significance
- Innovativeness
- Effectiveness/Synergy
- Replicability/Transferability
- Scalability
- Ecological responsibility
- Human-based approach

The first Global Smart Solution Report was launched in 2018. building on the momentum of the 2018 Taipei Smart City Summit & Expo (SCSE).

We received twelve submissions in our first report, and then successfully launched the "2019 Global Smart Solution Report: City Challenges and Innovations" during COP24 and 2019 SCSE.

The report outlines ten diverse urban challenges that cities have faced and further provides an overview of practical solutions applied to achieve their goals of inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable human settlements.
